Genevieve Jereb, OTR, is an Australian-born paediatric occupational therapist who has lectured on sensory processing disorders, both nationally and internationally. During her 10 years practicing in the United States, Genevieve has worked with leading US clinicians and lecturers, Colleen Hacker, MS, OTR, and Sheila Frick, OTR, co-teaching the course “Treatment Perspectives for Sensory Modulation Disorders.” Genevieve uses the principles of sensory processing theory to create music, songs and rhythmic activities for children with attention, motor and regulation difficulties. Her released recordings, including *No Worries, Say G'day!* and *Cool Bananas*, provide fun and engaging, ready-to-use rhythmic songs and activities to support self regulation for the “out of sync” child.

A fun, informative and interactive seminar for parents, teachers, therapists and other professionals who are interested in understanding the basics of sensory processing and in learning “ready-to-use” strategies to support learning, attention, social and emotional relationships and behaviour in the children they care for.
